Assignment due Tuesday, Feb 20: Phase 1 due – see Phase1Asst.pdf in google

- (1) Select your company from Leslie's Lemonade, Sharon's Shakes, or Gwen's Greeting Cards.
- (2) Go to your business model (3rd tab) and look at your bottom line
 - a. If you see a minus sign (and you should) your company is losing money
- (3) Plug in the Maryland minimum wage in your human resource section for all of your employees (hourly wage)
- (4) Go shopping (online, in a store, on the phone) for better prices on your consumables
- (5) Fill out your Price Report (2nd tab in your spreadsheet) showing your consumables, the number per unit in oz. or count, the cost per unit, and the source (where you shopped for each item)
- (6) Go to the business model (3rd tab in your spreadsheet) and plug in the same information you just filled out on your price report
 - a. # per unit in oz. or count
 - b. Cost per item sold
- (7) Check your bottom line to see if you are now making a profit. If you don't have a minus sign in front of your bottom line number (in the green cell) then you are no longer losing money
 - a. If you are still in debt (minus sign) see if you are in debt **by a lot less** – if you still have a minus sign, but the numbers are smaller, you are making progress.
 - b. Try adjusting your sales price and see if you become profitable (no more minus sign on your bottom line).
